

All hands on deck!

Pirate biscuits

Rations were hard to come by on board ship so pirates ate 'hard-tack' biscuits.

Make these at home and see what you think.

Put flour (3 cups), salt ($\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon), and dried yeast ($\frac{1}{2}$ sachet) into a bowl.

Gradually add 2 big spoons of water.

Knead into dough. Leave for 30 minutes.

Roll to 1 cm thick, cut out biscuit shapes and prick with a fork.

Put on a baking tray. Bake on 215°C / Gas Mark 7 for 30 minutes

Remove from the oven, leave to cool and eat!

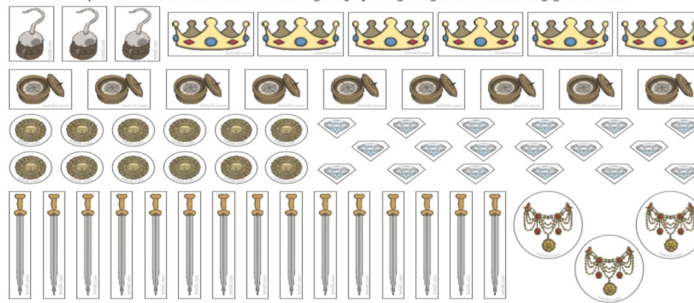
Flap the fish

Cut out fish shapes about A_5 in size. Use a rolled up newspaper as a fan to 'flap' the fish and move it. Create a fish obstacle course including things to go around, under and over. Which fish is the quickest? Which shape works best? Investigate different shaped fish to find the quickest design.



Pirate Treasure Fractions

The pirates have just found a new treasure chest. Pirate Jenny found it so she gets more than Pirate Jack. Split the treasure so that Pirate Jack gets $\frac{1}{3}$ of everything and Pirate Jenny gets the rest.

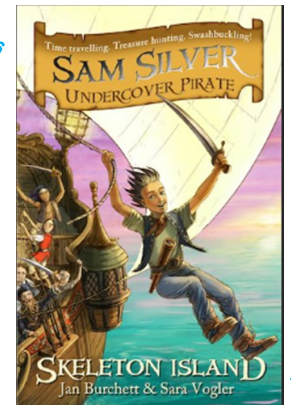


The pirates decide to sell all of their treasure;
